Last year in preparation for charge conference, the Church Council adopted goals for each of five reporting categories used in Equipping Vital Congregations. We have been reporting weekly our accomplishments as a church in reaching our goals. The beauty of this effort that is underway across the country is that it helps amass data that we can use to predict what makes a vital congregation. The indices are not absolutes, but The United Methodist Church started this effort with 32,000 churches in a study that began reporting in 2010.

Anytime that you assemble numbers some people, including me want to compare themselves to others.

We are cautioned not to make comparisons for the purpose of proving that we are better or worse than any other church. So here is the comparison for the first six months of 2013 for Trinity to the Country and to the James River District of which we are a part.

The table shows me that we are doing well compared to the averages except in professions of faith.

Now with that out of the way, the more important comparison is how are we doing compared to our goals?

Trinity is below its attendance goal by 2%. That is only four people per Sunday. We raised our goal from 2012 which was 164. Yes, we were aggressive. If we just invite two more families we will surpass the goal.

- Professions of faith are up by 40%. That growth will make the average go up for attendance eventually.
- We have the number of small groups that we predicted. We are about busting at the seams on Sunday.
- Mission Outreach is below our goal but the Adult Mission trip happens in the second half of the year.
- Our charitable giving is higher than we predicted. We clearly understand that needs are greater now.

This kind of evaluation is only possible if all the groups in the church report their individual activities. Please if your group goes out or gives to others send a report. A note in my box, an email, or text me at 804-338-3168 is most appreciated.

All in all these are numbers show that all of us as a community of the faithful are “Answering God’s Call to Impact Lives for Eternity through Ministry, Mission, and Worship.”
