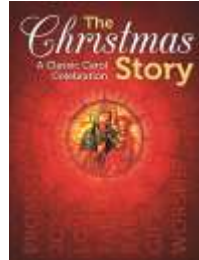

## CHRISTMAS AT CARES

God has been using our family at Trinity United Methodist Church to perform miracles at the CARES Shelter in Petersburg for about 20 years (none of us can remember just when we started this ministry). If this is your first Christmas at Trinity, CARES is a shelter in Petersburg that provides a home for women and children who have been abused. These determined women have removed their children from their home and are living at the shelter trying to start their lives over again.

The shelter staff is caring and compassionate. The ladies at the shelter are finally safe, and they receive counseling and help getting their lives back together. They look for jobs, if they don't already have one, and receive help finding a new place to live. And then Christmas morning arrives, and they get to see the love of Christ right before their eyes.

The Executive Director of CARES says she was told to expect wonders at the shelter on Christmas morning. Every client is celebrated with joy and respect which is not something that these women and children experience often. I have been told by former clients that their Christmas in the shelter was the best they had ever had. It's a tough world, and it wears out people, but when you have a moment of joy and delight tucked inside your heart, it will carry you through the hard times. I cannot thank you enough for giving these families such a precious gift in past years.

The Holy Spirit asks a lot from our family at Trinity...and we always respond. Last year, you provided almost \$6000. That money provided gifts to 23 women and children, a \$25 gift card for each CARES employee and ten \$50 gift cards that were used throughout the past year. Please look in your heart and support this vital ministry again this year. You can do any or all of the following:

- Keep these women and children in your prayers all year
- Place a check in the offering plate (mark CARES on memo line)
- Bake desserts for Christmas dinner at CARES (leave desserts in the kitchen when you attend our Christmas Eve service)
- Help buy the gifts (meet at TUMC at 8:30 am on Saturday 12/20)
- Help wrap the gifts (meet at TUMC at 4 pm on Saturday 12/20)

## PUMPKIN PATCH 2014 IN REVIEW

'Thank You' to everyone for making this year's Pumpkin Patch successful. As you may or may not already know, we have become known as 'the Pumpkin Church', and we do this as a community-outreach, to follow our missional statement to make disciples for Christ, to invite those looking for a church family to worship with us, and to raise money for missions. Activities by various groups in the church coincide with Pumpkin Patch so that each activity supports one another.

Overall, we had a good year, though not without some drawback. Temperatures were seasonal or slightly above seasonal, which I think helped folks get into an autumn mood early. In the past we've worn shorts up to Halloween and we've used a space heater and heavy coats to keep warm at night. Our living pumpkin patch also was a hit. Many enjoyed taking photos of children and family with the 'Peanuts' character display. Unfortunately, the pumpkin vines were all volunteers that sprouted in late May-early June. Consequently, the patch peaked about 6 weeks too soon and by October the vines were either dead or dying. We'll try again next year with plants that we sprout and adjust the planting time accordingly. I'm happy also to report that our Boy Scout troop and Cub Scout pack put up a display one weekend to promote their presence and activities. On the down-side, we had our share of rain: during off-loading, the UMW bazaar weekend, and on several weekdays.

This was our 16th year of 'Pumpkin Patch', and monetarily it was our third best year since 2002 (earliest reliable sales records) with total pumpkin sales, \$17,478 (see table below), that exceeded the annual average, \$16,303. Last year we began on Oct 8. This provides a convenient reference with which to compare 'early' (before Oct 8) and 'late' (Oct 8-31) sales. 'Early' sales have ranged from 10% to 28% of the annual total. This year was the 2nd-best year for 'early' sales, \$4,201, with the best three years for 'early' sales being 2011 to 2014. One explanation is that we are attracting more customers who are purchasing for fall decoration. Repeat customers report that our pumpkins typically do not rot as fast as pumpkins from other suppliers, plus we have a good assortment of other decorative items. In contrast, this was the 7th-best year for 'late' sales, \$13,277, which likely was a result of rain. Our 2014 profit was \$6,573 of which about \$2000 was donated to the church as a tithe and to cover associated expenses (lighting, water) and the remainder was equally divided among the UMM and UMW to support missions.
