PASTOR'S CORNER: GROW THE CHURCH

“Grow the Church”; it sounds like such a simple decision. We want to grow God’s church/gathering. We want to have more people; more people in worship; more people to join the choirs; more children in our children’s programs; more women in the UMW; more people to join in mission projects; more people to help with the pumpkin patch! One thing my children have taught me is that they are just as likely to do something different from me as they are to do it like me.

When people join we are thrilled to have them but they come with preset ideas. ‘Is it really possible that God would send us people with different priorities? With different dreams? God picks our roommates.

We are thrilled that so many new people have been joining our family. We welcome and celebrate the gifts and the visions you are bringing us. As we all learn to rearrange the house, I am so glad that it is God and God’s love the draws us and recreates us. TO LIFE!!!

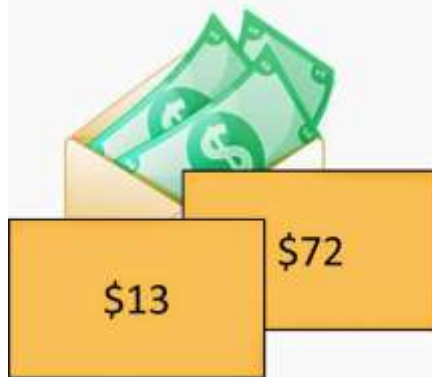
The youth are invited to attend the **Sedar Dinner** held by the 2014 confirmation class.

I sit here on my padded chair, with a cup of tea in my new Nana cup, in my warm home, surrounded by people I love and who love me. I sit here comforted and strong in the knowledge that our Savior died for me. I sit here thinking of the lost, the lonely, and the forgotten. I sit here praying for them, praying they come to know our Lord, and praying that this church family can bring some joy to the lives of the children.

There are so many children that need us this year: the children and Moms at CARES Battered Women and Children's Shelter whose world has been turned upside down by violence, violence at the hands of a loved one, someone that was to protect them; the children at UMFS who are separated from their families, trying to grow and heal from a home of unimaginable abuse; the children at Bellwood Elementary School whose stories we may not know, but who need help due to the constraints of poverty.

How can you help?

You can support the families at CARES with your monetary contributions, or with helping to shop and/or wrap on **December 20**.
