A VIEW FROM THE STAFF PARISH COMMITTEE

Last month we shared the questions that SPR had to answer in November and December about who they think Trinity is. In January the SPR has to answer another set of questions. The earlier questions create the resource and framework for this month.

Remember that last month the questions and answers were:

What are the church's priorities for mission and ministry?

We believe our priority and mission is to reach out to others in need within the church, locally, and nationally. We try to encourage and guide ourselves and each other in growing a stronger personal relationship with God both within our church and out to the community. We know we need to meet people at a variety of points in individual faith walks.

What are the church's three greatest strengths?

A loving and caring congregation; we demonstrate this by our outreach programs to help those in need. Our location: we are in a growing area and we are very visible. The variety of programs and activities that we offer.

In what area does our congregation need to develop strength?

We are trying to grow in our capacity to adjust. We are trying to work on communication skills. We keep working on developing our staff into a team.

WHAT TYPE OF PASTOR DO WE NEED?

Some of the answers were that we need a pastor that can engagingly preach, meet various needs, visits shut-ins, the sick, and new people and one who loves God's people. We want a pastor that works with volunteers, members and staff by providing guidance and encouragement. We want a pastor that helps the congregation grow in their spiritual faith.

Sometimes figuring out how to say what we need is challenging. Everyone wants to enjoy worship and feel loved. But what we want out of worship and how to meet different needs is so varied that we accept that we cannot be everything to everyone. Setting priorities can be challenging. We ask for your prayers and trust that God Is With Us.

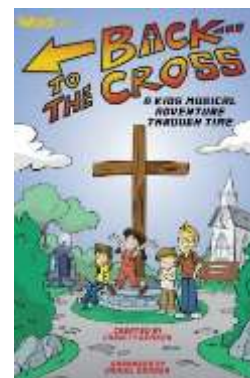

DISCIPLE IV CLASS

JOHN THOMAS "TOM" WALLACE

I would like to see more people taking Disciple IV. These classes do not have to be taken in order.

So I submit this writing to you that I probably wrote and emailed to many of you, probably in 2011.

I was a sinner and not the person I am today when I took that first class. The education of learning the way of God is now a walk in the light I understand. I am not perfect but I know the way and Disciple I, II and III helped me tremendously. PLEASE join with those that have signed up for Disciple IV. Classes begin soon with facilitators Paul Brown, Ed Cole, Jr, and Barbara Smith. If you need a ride to class please ask me or other class member.

There is a lot of reading and the workbook is around \$35 [ed note: the current book is available from Cokesbury for \$39.99]

One of the best things I have ever done was taking Disciple 1...

I have been away from church for many years; I found God in nature, and Yes, God is there. Going back to church was not easy. I lived in a deep, dark abyss. Occasionally I would stick my head out and look around, then slide back to the dark, cold depths – the world of sin. I was raised Methodist and I wanted to be so again.

I started out attending church in rural Tennessee where I visited the early service at a Methodist Church It was a cold church – there was no compassion, no understanding, no feeling of God's presence. I was totally alone.

I worked with mentally retarded and developmentally disabled adults at a State of Tennessee facility that was filled with love for the persons that resided there. The rules and regulations were unbearable, but my heart was with helping those that cannot help themselves. I had an instructor that radiated with God's presence and through Peggy I met probably the two best Christians I have ever known – Peggy and Byron Garland. I saw Peggy occasionally at the facility, and Byron became my barber. Every Friday night I would be at the barber shop's backroom and listen to a form of music and singing that lured me away from that abyss to a life in sunshine. Soon I was attending the Methodist early service and then driving to Oakland Cumberland Presbyterian Church to attend their service. When opening the doors of that church and going inside, I was never alone, the congregation was so warm and outgoing – God was everywhere! I was invited to eat at their home after church (as were many from church) and often stayed hours later as the children played, adults talked, and others rode horses n petted the mule. IT was a closeness I will never forget.

I moved back to Virginia and the search began for a church.

I ended up going to Trinity United Methodist Church where I attended the early service. I was greeted by Barbara and Doug Smith, and after services I was guided by Barbara to the Fellowship Sunday School Class; looks like I have found a church family and a church home. I even discovered that I have cousins that attend here, some that I did not know even existed and Cindy Morris that I had not seen in about 50 years!

I noticed as many that participate in all programs operations of the church, I decided to take Disciple I. This was scare for someone who never even been to a Bible study, but I realized that God would be with me and I took the step. Our facilitators were Barbara Smith and Paul Brown with classmates that I only knew casually or not at all. I was scared. We were told that during the course our classmates would form a special bond; we did and I love everyone in that group.

At the end of Disciple I, we talked about the strengths and weaknesses of each other. I think most everyone was dreading this, but it was positive and a joy! I knew I was not a teacher, a prophet, or other choice, so I decided that I would take a different ministry that "came to me" in 1999 after a near death illness. I enjoy people – the sick, the aged, the lonely and anyone that needs a visit. When I left the hospital in 1999 I felt an urge to communicate – phone calls, post cards and the computer. It helped me and it helped so many others! I have tried to visit church members that are ill or otherwise need a visitor and I am a member of The Virginia State Police Alumni where we have a Health and Welfare committee that lets others knew of deaths or illness. I have visited several former or retired troopers (usually from out of town) that are patients in local hospitals. This I my calling and I love it! I particularly liked this quote from a book I read:

"They need comfort, no theology. The best comfort is for them to know that someone is with them in their suffering, and that's where God really shines" - Don Piper, 90 Minutes in Heaven, page 118
