PASTOR'S CORNER

HOW DO WE RAISE THEM?

How do we learn to make decisions? How do we become aware of ourselves? How do we build relationships? I have been reading about developmental learning for several weeks. As I was reading Erickson and Kohlberg, and Piquet and Fowler...several questions have come to me.

One of the first questions the authors bat around, and about which they do not agree is: how do we raise our children?

Several of the educators believe that children's first responses are based on fear. The children do what they do because they are afraid that if they do not do as they are told, they will be denied what they need. They are afraid that if they do not do as they are told, they will be rejected, that they will be abandoned. Do we live this way? Do we do what we are told because of fear? We do not do it because we want to do it. Did we raise our children that we would not love them if they do not do as we tell them. Did we raise our children that they will be uncared for, if they behave in a way with which we disagree? Is it because of punishment? Other educators believe that children respond stronger and their response is longer lasting if the motivation is love and encouragement. Give children a secure and warm environment, encourage them and connect with them and they will be more likely to follow your path; they will be more likely to continue to explore your path. Do you do what you do because you feel right about it, are blessed by it, find purpose and inspiration from it? Have we surrounded our children with wonder and a sense of blessing and thanksgiving?

I had all this stuff spread out all over the floor of my office (you know me, I am always on the floor with stuff all around me!!!). My daughter comes in, scanning my posters and papers.... She notices the names at the tops of the charts: "I read about these people in school". We start walking through the thoughts. In a clip tone she interjects: "these people are Baptist and these are Methodist!" "What?" I respond. "Well," she continues, "some church denominations teach you that if you do not do as you are told, that you will go to Hell. They teach fear and punishment. Other denominations teach the song "Jesus Loves Me". They read the Run Away Bunny. They teach that God loves you and wants you to love him back."

"Oh!" I responded.

Got me thinking. Based on what do you make your decisions? Do you live the way you live because you are afraid of punishment? Do you fear that if you do not do, you will be denied what you need? You will be bad and go to Hell? Or do you do what you do because you are inspired, you want to give back, your experience is to make the heart bigger? Personally, I expect that all of us live a little out of both worlds. But I also expect that we live more out of one world than the other. Which world do you live out of the most? How did you teach your children to make decisions?

How we see ourselves and our place in it has a lot to do with the world we see and create around us.

Fear or security.....punishment or hope....you?
