The Ark of the Covenant was given to Moses, and Aaron built the first one. It was made of acacia wood and covered in gold. Angels were then fashioned of solid gold. These gleaming figures were placed on top at either end and stood watch on either side. And between the angels lay the 'mercy seat'. Here God's presence would sit. From here God would listen to the prayers of his people. He would hear their praises and their petitions. And from here He would receive their worship and offerings.



In today's worship halls, we position our alters or tables. Gold or brass candlesticks replace the gleaming winged angels. And the blood of Jesus is offered to God's mercy.

Where does God sit? God sits between the candles and on the 'mercy seat'. Every time anyone crosses in front of the alter, we are supposed to bow.

We bow to acknowledge God's presence.

We bow in respect to the King of Heaven & the Lord of Creation.

As you observe the acolytes bowing, join in with their respect and bow your hearts.

Administrative Council Meeting
Thursday, February 16, 2017

The Administrative Council of Trinity United Methodist Church met on Thursday, February 16, 2017, at Trinity UMC at 7 p.m. The meeting was Called To Order by Ed Barnes, Council Chairman. Rev Teresa Keezel opened the meeting with a prayer. Members present were Ed Barnes, Maury Beck, David Bailey, Ed Cole, Bob Ellis, Stephanye Fuina, Teresa Keezel, George Kingsley, Lana Lefferts, Maurice Linkous, John Morris, Mary Palmer, Bill Poole, Karen Poole, Dana Potter, Gary Potter, Tim Ruxton, Betty Sawyer, Ed Sismour, and Turner Wilkes. Minutes for the November and January meetings were approved, as published.

OLD BUSINESS:

Chairman Barnes asked if people were using the tax service being offered on Wednesday afternoons at the church, and two members replied affirmatively. Turner Wilkes mentioned seeing interest about it on Facebook.

Trustees Chairman Maurice Linkous announced that the parsonage has sold for a price of \$179,000, with closing set for February 28. The buyer has asked for early occupancy because of the early sale of his home, and the Trustees have agreed. Ed Barnes checked with the District Superintendent and the Bishop and with Church Attorney Robert Kane, all who have determined that our procedures for the sale were in order. Therefore, Maurice rescinded the motion he made last month to pursue a church conference.

- **MOTION:** Chairman Ed Barnes moved that we accept into the minutes two documents authorizing the sale of the parsonage and granting the easement for the neighbors carport. **Motion passed unanimously.** (Documents attached to these Minutes.)

Maurice also mentioned that Mike Sawyer would become Trustees Chairman at the conclusion of the parsonage sale and would become a member of the Council.

NEW BUSINESS:

Many questions have arisen concerning designated funds. A list of designated funds already established was distributed.

- **MOTION:** Finance Co-Chairman Bob Ellis made a motion that we accept the procedures as follows: If someone wants to establish a designated fund then they should request that from council through committee, so that council may approve the designated fund as one that furthers the ministry and missions of Trinity United Methodist Church. Once council has approved the designated fund then the Church may accept contributions to that designated fund and will segregate those amounts to be used for that designated

fund. Funds of the Church will only be used for the designated activity after the designated funds are exhausted.

During the discussion Betty Sawyer expressed concern that there was no Policy preceding the procedures. Rev. Keezel and David Bailey referenced The Book of Discipline Section 258.4 (f) "Contributions designated for specific causes and objects shall be promptly forwarded according to the intent of the donor and shall not be used for any other purpose" as the pre-established policy for these procedures.

Motion passed. (Document attached to these Minutes.)

In looking at the 2017 Designated Accounts list, Finance Chairman Ellis and Rev. Keezel made the following comment:

- Fund 2060-11 - - Helping Hands is for emergency needs on a short-term basis with a beginning and ending date. Leftover funds should be given to another project of a similar nature. As a result,
- **MOTION:** Bill Poole made a motion that the leftover money (\$35.06) from One Harvest, which is no longer in business, should be donated to FeedMore. **Motion passed.**

Chairman Ellis also distributed a Profit & Loss Sheet for January 2017 showing:

Total Income \$26,454.10
Total Expenses \$26,823.19
Net Income \$ -369.09 (Document attached to these Minutes.)

Proposed Softball Team:

Rev. Keezel reported that Stephanie Griffith is trying to organize an intergenerational softball team, hopefully involving attendees from both Sunday services.

- **MOTION:** Rev. Keezel moved that the Church sponsor the softball team by setting up a new line item in the Evangelism budget and by providing up to \$700 to cover team fees. **Motion passed.**

"Streaming" Project

Turner Wilkes distributed information on the possibility of broadcasting our church services on Facebook. A church member has donated \$3,500 toward the cost. The project would involve purchasing a new computer and additional microphones, purchasing a more comprehensive music license, securing a streaming service (i.e., Facebook LIVE), and upgrading the soundboard. In order to accomplish streaming, we would need two volunteer operators for each service - - one for the audio component and one for visual component. Mary Palmer expressed concern about broadcasting people's images without their permission. Discussion also centered on whether or not there was an interest in the congregation and also whether we would do live streaming or recorded streaming of the whole service or just part of it.

- **MOTION:** Tim Ruxton moved that we establish a volunteer exploratory committee, led by Turner Wilkes, to investigate "streaming" our services. **Motion passed.** (Document attached to these Minutes.)



Reports:

- Children's Ministries - - Attached to these Minutes
- Mission Committee - - Attached to these Minutes
- Building & Grounds - - Gary Potter is pursuing the possibility of modifying the two classrooms damaged by water and giving them access to the bathroom from inside the classrooms, as well as from the hallway. He will meet with the Sunday School Superintendent and those teachers involved to discuss the best plan. The classrooms are now usable on a temporary basis. Insurance will cover the water damage, with a \$500 deductible.
- Nominations: Ed Cole is the new United Methodist Men President, and as announced earlier, Mike Sawyer will be the new Trustees Chairman.
- United Methodist Women: President Betty Sawyer reported that the women will be holding a Homemade Soup Sale during February, with a deliver date of March 5, to raise funds for their projects.

The next Administrative Council meeting will be Thursday, April 20, 2017, at 7 p.m.

Chairman Barnes adjourned the meeting at 8:20 p.m. with a closing prayer by Maury Beck.

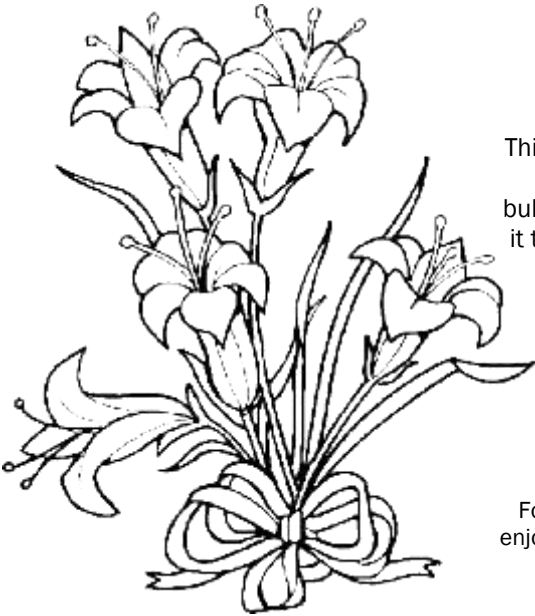
