## SALE OF THE PARSONAGE

Every journey has a beginning and an end. So it goes with the sale of the church parsonage. This was not a decision saying that Trinity could not have a parsonage. Instead it was a decision that the parsonage needed serious updating, was under sized based on today's standards, repairs were becoming more and more frequent, the parsonage did not house a minister full time and a general change in the philosophy of housing a church minister is emerging. There is a growing trend to pay a minister a housing allowance, after all shouldn't a minister have the security of a home when the time comes to retire. If in the future a time comes that Trinity wants a parsonage, it can vote to have one. But pursuant to the discipline it has to be "Handicap Ready" either in the form of new construction or modification of an existing home. This of course isn't cost effective.

The journey to sell the parsonage began in May 2015. There were many hurdles to overcome. The church could not afford a housing allowance along with church mortgage payments. The solution was to use the parsonage sale proceeds to curtail the church mortgage. The discipline prohibits that without special authorization. Thus a trip to meet with the District Superintendent was necessary. The goal was to convince the DS that an investment in the church mortgage would yield a higher return than what was available in the marketplace.

With that green light came convincing the church council. While I believe that council was on board, it took three strikes to gain a green light which came in July 2016. But a hurdle remained and that was to hold a Charge Conference. Following that there were several legal steps that we as a church had to go through before a deed of transfer could be made to a new owner. The Charge Conference was held in September 2016 and a full bright green light began to shine.

I desired the opportunity to expose the house for sale before listing with a real estate agent. Counsel granted me that authority along with up to \$15,000 to improve the property to marketable condition. After all no prospective buyer would want a pink bathtub, low rise toilets, worn kitchen vinyl, soiled carpet, a dark paneled family room not to mention the lack of curb appeal and numerous minor things. The following improvements were done:

On the interior:

- Resurfaced the bathtub to the color white
- Replaced both toilets to 17"
- Painted the family room white
- Replaced the vinyl in the kitchen and utility room
- Had the hardwood floors sanded and refinished
- Had granite counter tops installed in the kitchen, bath and vanity
- Changed the electrical fixtures from dark to white

On the exterior:

- Regraded and reshaped the driveway
- Removed and replaced the shrubbery
- Resurfaced the sunken concrete in the front stoop
- Repaired the sidewalk cracks and extended it 8'
- Power washed the front, garage side and back brick 6' high
- Repaired the cracks in the garage concrete apron

As I said earlier, everything has a beginning and end. Actually the end was February 21, 2017 when the sale of the parsonage closed. I had marketed the house until the first week of December and realized that I was not reaching the audience desired. I interviewed 3 Real Estate Agencies and selected ReMax Commonwealth to list with. The agent's suggested listing price was \$169,000 but I was confident at \$179,500 and made that the listing. Within 2 weeks we received 2 offers. The first would have closed earlier but wanted closing costs, prepaid's, home warranty, home inspection to be paid by the church. The 2nd offer was a VA Loan with our responsibility being only paying for a home warranty, and repairs found in the home inspection. Electrical problems and a slow water leak was found in the inspection costing us approximately \$500.



So the bottom line is:

Selling price.	\$179,000
Sale Proceeds.	166,726. (After R/E Commission & Closing Costs)

Renovations and Utilities.	11,601.19
Net Sales Proceeds	155,124.81

Mortgage Loan Payoff	142,456.22
Net Designated Building Funds	12,668.59

Wells Fargo Bank wanted a written request for the mortgage loan payoff and said there would be a prepayment penalty. I asked for a copy of the promissory note evidencing the penalty. The loan originated with Community Bank in Petersburg and that bank has been through 3 mergers becoming Wells Fargo. I felt in all probability the note would be lost and they would be unable to evidence a prepayment penalty or that one didn't exist. There was not a penalty in the payoff.

A lot of people participated in preparing the house for sale. I wish to acknowledge all of those that helped but particularly George Kingsley who worked with me side by side and Gary Potter who worked diligently to create the necessary curb appeal to enhance the sale of the parsonage.

# Cookie Baking Instructions and Recipes

Recipes are furnished as a guide only. You can use any recipe you desire. **It is, however, very important not to use icing, sugar, or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookies, or to add any kind of fruit to the cookies.**

Cookies should be approximately 2 to 2 ½ inches in size.

Package cookies 12 to a quart size zip lock bag.

Please indicate the type of cookie on each bag.

**DO NOT package HOT cookies.** Let them cool. They may be made weeks ahead of time and frozen – they still turn out perfect.

## **Easy Cookies**

2 packages white or yellow cake mix*	1 cup cooking oil
4 teaspoons water	4 eggs
2 cups (12 oz pkg) flavored chips*	2 cups rolled oats

Preheat 350 degrees. Blend cake mix, water, oil, and eggs. Stir in chips and oatmeal. Place cookie dough in refrigerator about one hour. Drop by heaping teaspoons (to make 2" cookies) onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 8 minutes (top will look pale). Cool on sheet 1 minute and remove to wire rack. Completely cool before packaging.

**\*\***You can use any flavored chips (chocolate, peanut butter, swirled, toffee, etc.) but nothing like M&Ms, Reese's Pieces, etc. You can also use chocolate cake mix or strawberry and lemon cake mixes.

## **Peanut Butter**

3/4 cup Creamy Peanut Butter	1 egg
1/2 cup Crisco Shortening	1-3/4 cup all-purpose flour
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar	3/4 teaspoon salt
3 tablespoons milk	3/4 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon vanilla	

Combine peanut butter, shortening, sugar, milk and vanilla in a large bowl and mix at medium speed until well blended. Add egg and mix well. In a separate bowl combine flour, salt and baking soda, mix well. Add flour mixture to peanut butter and mix until just blended. Drop by heaping teaspoons onto ungreased cookie sheet and flatten slightly in a crisscross pattern with the tines of a fork. Bake at 375 degrees for 7 to 8 minutes until set. Makes 3 dozen cookies.

### **Chewy Oatmeal**

3/4 cup butter flavor Crisco  
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
1 egg  
1/3 cup milk  
1-1/2 teaspoon vanilla

3 cups quick cooking oats  
1 cup all purpose flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon baking soda  
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Combine Crisco, brown sugar, egg, milk and vanilla in a large bowl. Mix at medium speed until well blended. Combine oats, flour, salt, baking soda and cinnamon in a separate bowl, mix well. Add to Crisco/sugar mixture until just blended. Drop rounded tablespoons of dough onto cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes or until lightly browned. Makes 2-1/2 dozen cookies.

### **Chocolate Chip**

3/4 cup Crisco shortening  
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
2 tablespoons milk  
1 teaspoon vanilla

1-3/4 cup all purpose flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
3/4 teaspoon baking soda  
1 cup semi-sweet choc chips  
1 egg

Combine shortening, sugar, milk and vanilla in a large bowl, mix until well blended. Add egg and mix well. In a separate bowl combine flour, salt and baking soda, mix well. Add to shortening/sugar mixture until well blended. Stir in chocolate chips. Drop by rounded tablespoon onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes for chewy cookies or 11 to 13 minutes for crisp cookies. Makes 3 dozen cookies.

### **Molasses Cookies**

3/4 cup margarine or shortening  
1 cup granulated sugar  
1 egg  
4 tablespoons molasses

1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1 teaspoon ginger  
2 cups flour  
2 teaspoons baking soda

In a large bowl, cream margarine or shortening with sugar. Add egg and blend. Add molasses and spices; mix well. Add flour and baking soda and blend. Chill dough 30 minutes or overnight (covered tightly). Shape dough into small balls and place 2-inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 10-12 minutes. Remove from oven and cool on wire racks. Makes 2 1/2 dozen.

## Sugar Cookies

1 cup margarine (or butter); (2 sticks) at-room temperature	1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup vegetable oil	4 cups all-purpose flour
1 cup granulated sugar	1 teaspoon salt
1 cup powdered sugar	1 teaspoon baking soda
2 eggs	1 teaspoon cream of tartar

Beat together margarine, oil, granulated sugar, powdered sugar, eggs and vanilla. Sift together flour, salt, baking soda and cream of tartar. Add dry ingredients to margarine mixture. Drop from a teaspoon onto greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees until cookies are light brown around the edges, about 8 to 10 minutes (watch closely; cookies will be dry if they get too brown). Makes approximately 5 dozen.

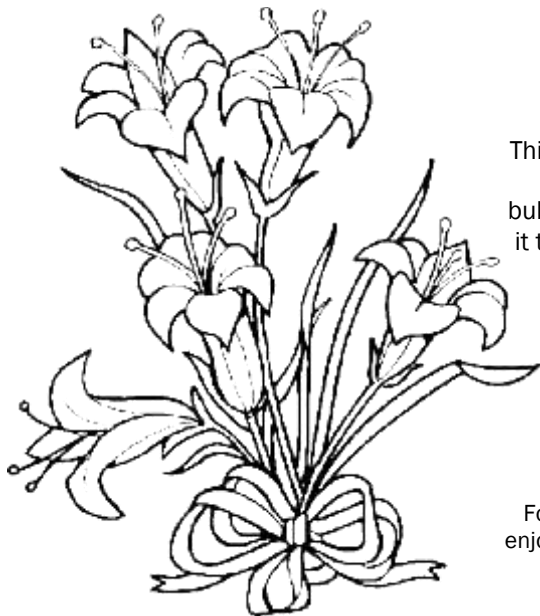
